Preemptive

What is Preemptive? (As listed in any dictionary)

- ❖ Preemptive, taken as a measure against something possible, anticipated, or feared; preventive; deterrent

Based on this first definition, there are certain measures a person can take every day to prevent spiritual attacks to arise. Or if something comes up suddenly, it can be prevented or deterred.

- ❖ Preemptive, Bridge. pertaining to, involving, or noting an opening bid, or an overcall in a suit that is at an unnecessarily high level, and that is essentially a defensive maneuver designed to make communication between one's opponents more difficult

In this second definition, in a court of law, someone on the case may notice an opening or a bridge that could be used as a defense maneuver, or to make communication difficult with the opponents in the case.

Preemptive Attacks

Preemptive Attacks are what the enemy plans and executes when you are planning to do something for the kingdom of God, or even in your everyday life. Let's look at some examples...

- ❖ In **Genesis 4:8** Cain slew his brother Abel. This was a **preemptive attack** to stop the bloodline by which Jesus' lineage would come
- ❖ In **Matthew 2:7-14** is the story of Herod making an effort to find the young child (Jesus) to destroy Him. Another **preemptive attack**, but it was unsuccessful
- ❖ **1 Peter 5:8** Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour

Each day, believers must offensively prepare their spiritual environments and **preemptively strike first through warfare prayer!**

Let God's children reverse roles by applying the Preemptive Attacks on the enemy, to fight persistently, and with resilience!

Warfare Prayer Verbiage

Based on what we've just learned, let's introduce some statements that you would include while building your warfare prayer.

Opening petition prayer to Jesus:

Knowing you are going into a hostile environment.

- ❖ Lord, I know you have given me (**Exousia**) power to tread upon serpents and scorpions (**Luke 10:19**), to bind and loose on earth as it is bound and loosed in heaven (**Matthew 16:19**). Holy Spirit, I ask for you to give me revelation (**John 14:26**), wisdom (**James 1:5-7**), and the words I need to speak

Warfare prayer against darkness:

Binding spirits and their tongues to prevent attacks.

- ❖ I now Command all evil spirits operating in (**name people, meeting room, etc.**) to be bound hands and feet together. I place a bloodline around each of you, and ask the angels to isolate you from working together, and to take you to the feet of Jesus now

Warfare Prayer Verbiage

Warfare prayer against darkness, continued:

Binding spirits and their tongues to prevent attacks.

- ❖ I Command your tongues to be at “Peace” (muzzle or silence) (Mark 1:25) where you cannot communicate with any other above you, below you, or around you. I ask the angels to enforce this torment and I consider it done and in effect now

Closing prayer to Jesus:

Thank the Lord for the Exousia and Dunamis Power!

- ❖ Thank You Jesus for giving us the authority and the power to use your name to tread upon serpents and scorpions (Luke 10:19). Thank you that I have the authority to bind and loose (Matt 16:19) in your name. Lord I have spoken in the spiritual realm (Gen 1:3,6,9,11 & Matt 21:19-21), and I consider it done, and in effect now in Jesus' name, Amen
